1. **Call to Order / Welcome and Introductions– Kim Keleher, Chair**

2. **Crisis Services Update – Ashley Miller & Melissa Drey**

***Turning Point (as presented at the Coalition Meeting prior to this meeting)**

Ashely Miller Provided an update: They are working on updating information on referrals concerning individuals that were not admitted to the home. There are various reasons the referrals were not admitted such as: calls were made but referral was not sent and or the person decided not to go – Ashely will break down it further. 187 persons have been in the program since opening and 142 completed the program. 288 referrals have been made 51 homeless persons have been in the program. Marketing continues and a video has been made and is on the PAMHC Facebook page and Melissa can email it out to anyone interested, also a mailer will be done. Accreditation has been received and working with MCOs on billings. C3 training will be done with Northwest Iowa Care Connection Region for staff to be trained.

***Pre-Screening**

Melissa Drey – 4 calls have been received in the region from July 1, 2017 – 3 from Sac and one from Crawford County Memorial Hospital. With the new legislation and ITP in the EDs

prescreening will look differently and Melissa will work with hospitals and ITP.

***Crisis Intervention Training**

Melissa Drey – Daniel McGinnis from Denison PD has been trained. He has implemented his training several times and has referred several people to the Denison Rolling hills Office for assistance.

If anyone is interested in future training please let Melissa know

Contracts with PAMHC have been sent to all the jails to contract for therapy (therapist will be sent to the jail). Cherokee and Crawford are the only two that have not responded. This is to make it easier for the jail to eliminate transports. All contracts will be effective July 1, 2018.

Ken McClure – staffing levels and manpower is the issue, sending a person for 40 hours, for CIT training, and some are not interested. Ken asked about having a training in our area. There will be a training in Webster County and Caren will look for information of when and who will be training. Melissa will check and see about setting up a training in our region.

Debriefing was discussed and Melissa can send a letter out to law enforcement, fire departments, EMS and other agencies to remind them who to call if a debriefing is needed. Melissa is also looking at training to increase the number of those trained including therapists.

3. Stepping Stones Update – Lisa Meyer (as presented at the Coalition Meeting prior to this meeting)

Currents stats: 47 admits, bed days are at 3647, 110 referrals 10 on waiting list now. One person is moving out today and Friday a person will be admitted from Turning Point. Average 77.725 length of stay, and she says this is increasing. 25 referrals from Turning Point, 13 from PAMMHC, 13 Manning Family Recovery, 10 from regional Coordinators, 3 from family, and the rest from other places (nursing homes, other regions, and so forth). Would like staff to be C3 trained and currently doing Mental Health First Aid training.

4. I-START Coordinator Carin Weltzheimer

Caren started in March with I-Start and has her first referral intake today at Wesco. Once a person is taken into the program Carin will be part of the team to develop a crisis plan and training to staff. The goal is work the program in 18 months.

5. FY'19 Annual Service and Budget Plan

Dawn reviewed the plan with the board which is located on the website. Dawn also provided a financial forecast for FY19 (see attached).

7. Evidenced Based Practices – Status of provider implementation discussion

Dawn prepares and provides a report quarterly to the State. She is wanting to know if there is something the providers would like to be trained on to help with EBP's. Lisa Bringle reports that there will be a partnership with IACP, QSDA and the Regions to provide training. The list should be added that PAMHC provides treatment of co-occurring

8. Other?

Role and future of coalition and advisory board as there has been a lot of duplication with the two. With new legislation there may be a need for task forces to meet beyond the coalition and advisory board to work on development of new services that are mandated. The advisory board is mandated. Kim recommended suspension of the coalition at least until the rules for new services come out and then turn to task forces for development. Zack suggested possible use of phone or go to webinar meetings.
